From the Yavapai County Sheriff's Office-

This is an update regarding evacuations that are being lifted this morning – **Please note the special details and times-** A Code Red alert is in the process of being issued ---

As of 10 AM this morning, evacuations are lifted for the following communities –

Walker, Potato Patch, Mount Union, Mountain Pine Acres, Pine Flat (Forest Road 177) – **FOR RESIDENTS ONLY**, Poland Junction West side and south to Mayer, west side.

As of 12 PM today, the evacuation is lifted for the following area -

Breezy Pines (Forest Road 58) – **FOR RESIDENTS ONLY**

For Breezy Pines and others whose wells may be impacted, please consider avoiding use of water for cooking or consumption until the water is tested. Please contact Yavapai County Health at 928-583-1000 if you have questions.

Although evacuations have been lifted and roads reopened, property owners are urged to remain vigilant and monitor fire news. There is still active fire behavior, particularly in the northern portion of the fire, and conditions can change easily if impacted by high wind events.

Again, all the cooperators involved in the Goodwin Fire truly appreciate the cooperation and support of all the residents affected by these closures. YCSO will be maintaining patrols in these areas throughout the day.

A message from the Yavapai County Flood Control District:

The Flood Control District. There is a reasonable potential that the watersheds within the burn area, including Big Bug Creek and its tributaries, and Turkey Creek and its tributaries, will see increased flows and mudflows as the debris and ash from the fire are washed downstream. Any residential structure in Yavapai County is eligible for flood insurance under the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP). This includes structures in a Special Flood Hazard Area as mapped by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). There is a waiver to the 30-day waiting period for flood insurance if any claims are for a flood resulting from a fire on Federal property and the policy was purchased prior to the flooding event. Any residents downstream of the burn area are encouraged to talk to your insurance agent about obtaining flood insurance. More information on flood insurance can be found at www.floodsmart.gov. 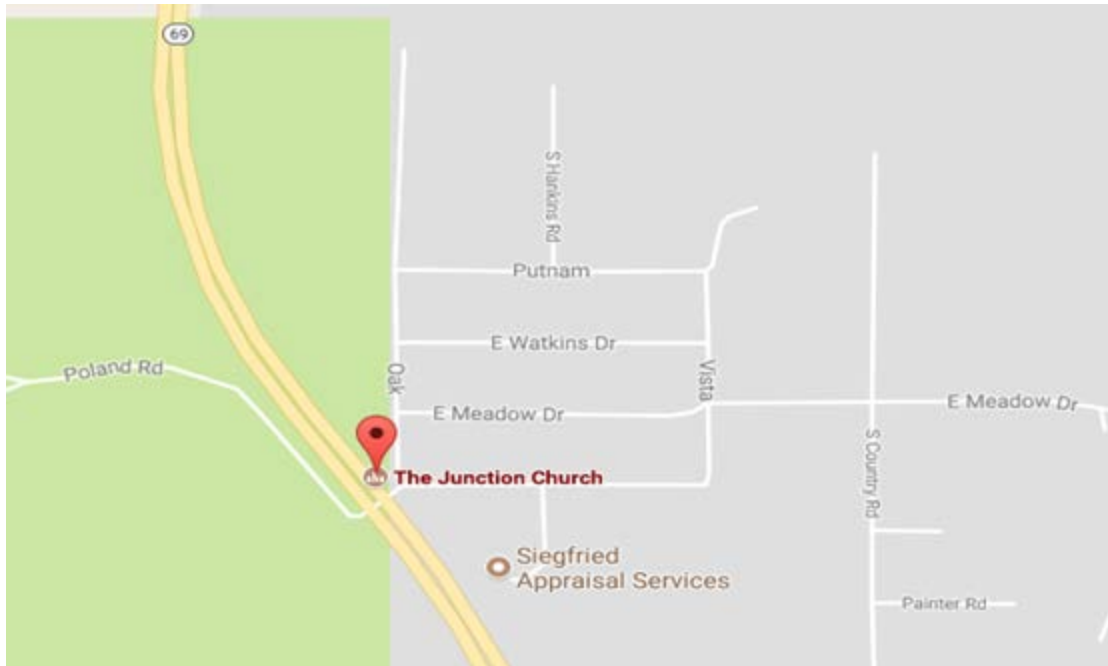

These efforts help mitigate the effects of flooding on new and improved structures. Overall, the program reduces the socio-economic impact of disasters by promoting the purchase and retention of general risk insurance, but also of flood insurance, specifically.

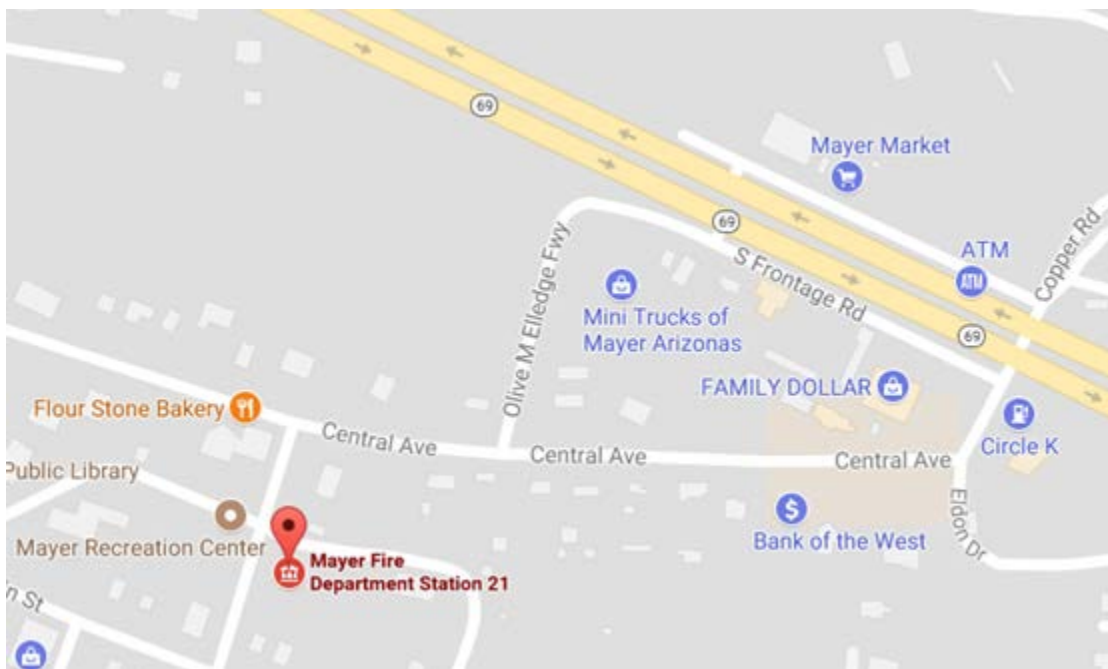
Sandbags and sand are available at the following locations. You will need to fill the bags yourself.
